- Communication and language
- Personal, social and emotional development
- Physical development
- Literacy
- Maths
- Understanding the world

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Phonics

- In Reception year we start from Phase 2. We use a scheme called 'Floppy's Phonics' to teach phonics.
- Each session has four different elements:-
 - Revisit
 - Teach
 - Apply
 - Practise

- There is a large library of e-books on Oxford Owl, and you can choose from a selection which are at your child's reading level
- We will also shortly be introducing Numbots, an app where your child can practise number skills through games

Reading

Reception

- Everyday we have regular story sessions.
- From the summer term we will have group reading sessions using DSR.
- When your child is ready, we will start sending home a non-decodable and phonics book/phonics sheet each week – if your child is still getting to grips with the initial sounds we may send home some flash cards to practise individual sounds first.
- From next week, we will send home a free choice library book each week.
- In the front of the reading record book are some high frequency words. It is useful for your child to be able to read by sight.

Writing

- We spend a lot of time initially learning how to form the letters correctly and then use them to form words and sentences.
- By the end of the year, children are expected to hold the pencil properly, make phonetically plausible attempts at words and start to write in sentences.

Writing

Talk for writing

- To help develop children's writing, we use the Talk for Writing approach.
- Each unit of work is based on a story and has two stages
 - Imitation (retelling the story verbally or writing)
 - Innovation (where they change an aspect of the story)

Maths

- In the Autumn term we will begin to focus on a number each week by investigating the number in different contexts.
- The children will also use Numicon to help develop their understanding of number.

Tapestry

- In Reception we use an online journal to record observations made of your child.
- These observations help us track your child's development against age related expectations.
- You have access to your child's tapestry journal via the app or website.
- You will be able to see observations/photos and/or videos with the development matters referenced against them.
- If you wish to upload something that your child has done at home or wish to comment on an observation that has been made you are able to do this via the app or website.
- Your child will be a focus child 1-2 times per term where the teacher/nursery nurse will try to make an observation against each of the 7 areas.
- Additional observations will be made when the teacher/nursery nurse sees something that demonstrates a progression in their learning

Illness

- <u>Be Covid sensitive</u> If someone in your household has a temperature or a persistent cough, loss or smell or taste do not send them to school.
- If your child has a <u>stomach bug</u> please keep them at <u>home for 48</u>
 <u>hours</u> after the last incidence of vomiting or diarrhoea.
