Crimson and Scarlet Classes

Welcome back to Year 4 and a Happy New Year to you all!

It is lovely to be starting back in the New Year with the children and we are very much looking forward to all of the fantastic learning we have planned for this term. The children have returned with renewed enthusiasm and a vigour for learning. Thank you all for your continued support.

Curriculum

<u>Maths</u> This term in maths, we are continuing our work on multiplication and moving onto using the column method to solve multiplication problems up to 3 digits. The children will be developing their understanding of dividing whole numbers by 10, 100 and 1000 and their knowledge of factors and factor pairs. We will also be looking at measurement, focusing on different units of measure. We will then move on to perimeter and area, calculating this for a variety of rectilinear shapes. Through each strand, we will continue to undertake reasoning and problem solving questions and try to relate the maths to everyday life.

English The children are looking at contemporary fiction this half term and we are using the book 'Gorilla' by Anthony Browne for our inspiration. We will be learning to write a variety of sentences to describe, and are building our bank of emotive language to express a character's thoughts and feelings. Then, we will be moving on to look at persuasive writing. The children will be persuading their audience to sponsor an endangered species and persuading their audience to think about their actions in helping to save these animals.

Science In the first half term, we will be finishing off our work on the digestive system. We will be drawing and labelling the different parts of the digestive system and discussing how enzymes and acid are all part of us digesting food. Then we will be discovering all about sound, vibrations and sound waves. We will be making lots of noise in this unit and carrying out several experiments. The classes will even be making their own instrument of choice. In Spring 2, we will move on to 'Living things and their habitats'. In this unit we will investigate food chains and even use branching diagrams for some classification work.

<u>History</u> We are continuing with the theme of the Romans and learning more about how they impacted life in Britain with their traditions and innovations. Then, we will also be investigating how ancient Britons lived before the Roman invasions.

Enrichment (Music, PE & French)

Music: Year 4 will continue to learn their respective instruments. On Tuesday mornings, Scarlet are carrying on with violins, and Crimson are continuing with trumpets and trombones on Wednesdays. It is amazing to see how far the children have come in such a short time and we are all looking forward to some concerts.

PE: Spring 1 is focused on gymnastics with elements of dance incorporated. The children will be developing their own gymnastics/dance routine, learning gymnastic shapes/balances and counter-balances, as well as dance concepts and fundamental jumps and rolls. We will also be exploring the gymnastics apparatus to develop confidence in climbing, jumping and balancing. **Spring 2** is focused on Handball, learning the core skills of passing/receiving, shooting and utilising space. The children will learn the rules as well as basic tactics. We will also have 2 Hockey lessons learning all basic techniques and structured rules.

French: The children will learn vocabulary about family members, numbers 30-70, and how to describe someone. taking into account the order of nouns and adjectives.

<u>RE</u>

Our first big question this term is, 'How do Christians believe following Jesus' new commandment, and his two greatest commandments, make a difference?' We will be looking at the commandments and discussing their meaning. The children will reflect on what the commandments and the sentiment behind them means to them personally.

Our second big question this term is, 'Do fame and the Christian faith go together?' We will be looking at a variety of celebrities and how their faith helps them to cope in their particular industries or fields. We will also reflect on what helps us cope in our own lives.

Homework

Homework will be given out every Friday. Please ensure your child completes the tasks set and returns their work by the following Wednesday. The work set each week is to scaffold their learning in class that week and will enhance their learning. It also provides you with an insight to what they have been learning about. Please ensure children are logging onto their timetable rock stars to practice their timetables – if new logins are required, please speak to your class teacher.

General Reminders
