

Reception Summer Term Newsletter 2023

Goslings and Ducklings Classes

Dear Reception Parents and Carers,

We hope you all have had a restful and fun filled Easter holiday and are looking forward to the summer term.

English

This term, we will continue to develop the children's literacy skills using their phonic knowledge to read, spell and write. During phonics sessions, the children will learn the Level 3 sounds in Floppy's Phonics, focusing on vowel digraphs and trigraphs. We will continue writing short sentences that start with a capital letter, contain finger spaces and end with a full stop. This will be supported through 'Talk for Writing', which will introduce the children to skills such as using conjunctions and adjectives which will help prepare them for Year 1. We are looking forward to hatching ducklings in class and will be writing factual reports about them. This term we will start DSR (daily supported reading) where the children will be reading in groups, concentrating on recognising sight vocabulary word and inference skills.

Maths

We will continue to work with numbers 0-20 and beyond, along with addition and subtraction to consolidate everything that the children have learnt so far and work on practical ways of sharing and grouping.

The children will develop their understanding of naming and counting coins to support their learning with money. We will also be looking at different ways of measuring and revising 2D & 3D shapes and their properties. We will revisit subitising through a variety of manipulatives and visuals, which will develop the children's number sense.

RE

We will be learning about why Christians believe Jesus performed miracles. We will also be learning about Jewish culture and practices.

PE

In the first half term the children will be learning the basics of rugby, football and basketball with Mr Oakley. In the second half term they will learn tennis and cricket. Class teacher PE lessons will focus on fitness.

Topic

Our topic this half term is 'Do cows drink milk?', and we will be learning about farming, farm animals and how food is grown. We will be going on a trip to Freightliners Farm. We will also observe and discuss the life cycle of a duck, as we are very excited to announce that we will be hatching our own ducklings this term. Later on in the term, the children will make simple maps of familiar environments such as the school playground. In summer 2, our topic is 'What can we see in summer?' and we will explore the different flowers we might see in the local area, the type of fruits that will grow for us to enjoy, and the food we might eat. We will be exploring what temperatures we might experience and clothing we might wear.
