Part One

- 1. **Prayers** opening prayers led by Calvin Henry
- 2. **Notified Absences –** apologies received from all those absent, as recorded.
- 3. Late agenda items none
- 4. Governors' declarations of interest:
 - a) Annual register of business interests governors were reminded to complete their annual declaration of business interests on governorhub, if they had not already done so.
 - b) Declarations of any interest specific to this agenda none

5. Chair's Introduction

- (1) Paul French was welcomed to his first full FGB as an elected parent governor.
- (2) Recent changes to the GB composition has an adverse impact on Committee membership, with some meetings unable to achieve quoracy. CA proposed that the GB appoint two additional Associate Governors to help resolve this issue. The two parent governors unsuccessful in the recent election for the Parent Governor role were interested in becoming Associate Governors.

Action: The proposal to appoint two additional Associate Governors was unanimously Approved.

- (3) Governors were informed of the HEP On-Line Safeguarding training course on 23 January 2023 and invited to attend, if available
- (4) Governors agreed that Link Visits to school should re-commence in Spring term

6. Behaviour Presentation (DHT, Steve Baptiste report).

- 6.1 SB reported on the school's approach to behaviour management which has been operating since 2021. Governors received, on screen, the most recent Behaviour Report with data collated from the Integris software. It was noted that consultant, Tracey Campbell, had provided training and support to SB to help embed the principles of behaviour management.
- 6.2 It was noted that the previous Ofsted Report had flagged up issues of behaviour as being of concern and SB described the actions taken to address those concerns:
- (a) the implementation of the Post Ofsted Action Plan
- (b) the use of Integris software to record all behaviour issues, by child, by category and by subsequent intervention including parental contact if necessary.
- 6.3 Governors questioned the summary pupil Behaviour Report and questioned how it was prepared to better understand the process by which incidents were logged, graded, marked by location Rectory Gardens or Church Lane, tracked (for emerging patterns) and intervention taken appropriate to the context. It was noted that the school's Behaviour team was SB, Aria Zavrou and Duncan Beardwell. reporting to the Headteacher, CH.
- 6.4 The Behaviour Report was maintained for each Term with a review at each Term end.
- 6.5 The pastoral team from Greig City School was providing additional external support working with specific pupils in Y5 helping them to develop their identities and improve friendships. This work is ongoing. Another focus is on supporting Y6 pupils as they prepare to transition to secondary schools.
- 6.6 Governors asked to have additional detail in behaviour reporting. This is to be presented at the next FGB meeting.

Action: Additional detail added to behaviour reporting to March 2023 FGB

7. Ofsted Inspection Update (Interim Chair report)

- 7.1 Governors had received the minutes of the additional FGB held on 14 November 2022 which detailed the outcome of the 9/10 November 2022 Monitoring Visit and subsequent Sct. 5 inspection.
- 7.2 Governors were delighted with the conclusions reached by the Inspectors in their Monitoring Visit and with the overall outcome for the school at the conclusion of the subsequent Section 5 Inspection. As a result of the Inspection the school had been graded "Good for overall effectiveness" and "Good" for every category within the inspection framework.
- 7.3 It was anticipated that the draft Ofsted Report would be received on 8 December. Governors noted that the Inspection team this time comprised of four senior HMI and one Ofsted Inspector. CH commended governors, LDBS and the staff for their unwavering support to the school throughout the inspection process.
- 7.4 CH confirmed that the agency previously used in preparing communications about the previous Ofsted Report will be asked to draft the communications reporting the new Grade. This communication would be shared with governors prior to release. Banners proclaiming the new Grade were ready for posting in strategic locations at both school sites to inform parents and the wider community of the Ofsted result.
- 7.5 It was noted that the Admissions deadline was 15 January and from the start of the Spring term the school will host daily site walks for prospective parents and pupils. Feeder nurseries were also being contacted.
- 7.6 Governors considered how this new Grade would impact on the proposed requirement to transition to Academy status. Governors considered the options of remaining under its present constitution or seeking Academy status noting that LDBS was supporting the option of the school remaining under its present constitution. Governors were asked to vote on the two options:
- a) to continue to transition to Academy status
- b) to remain under its present governance structure

Action: Governors were unanimous in their decision to adopt option b) and remain under its present governance structure.

7.7 Governors asked that a letter be sent to the Secretary of State before term end explaining the reasons for the request to cease the pathway towards Academisation

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Action: The Chair of Governors to write to the Secretary of State before the term end, requesting an end to the process towards becoming an Academy.

10. Headteacher's Report (CH)

10.1 The HT's Report was shared on screen: key points:

School Roll 418 with 73 vacancies

Composition 51% girls EAL 47.5% Pupil Premium 24%

Safeguarding Visit 21 June 2022; next visit scheduled

SIAMS inspection not expected this year; last visit 2016 – with **Good** outcome

10.3 Attendance 95% (target 96%) lower than expected due to recent sickness bug among children

10.4 Exclusions: none

10.5 Staff: Helen Hutchings, SBM, became ill while working at school and subsequently died on 22 November. The funeral will be on 19 December. Staff have been left shocked by this event. The school is making available support through the Employee Assistance Programme, Counselling and the Church. Governors were deeply saddened to hear the news and asked that their respects and best wishes be passed to Helen's family.

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10.6 It was noted that the LBH SEND had recently visited the school and in light of the revised Ofsted Grade were again expressing an interest in pursuing the project to convert the Church Lane site to a St Mary's Autism Unit site supporting some of the Borough's most vulnerable children. The project will require DfE Funding but would provide both financial benefits to the Borough and high quality provision for children living with autism. It was noted that if the project receives approval Y1 and Y2 could move into Rectory Gardens in September 2023; Early Years could move across in 2024/25. Church Lane could therefore open partially from September 2023. LBH would have to fund the capital works required to upgrade the Rectory Gardens site to kickstart the project.

Action: Governors would receive a Church Lane project report in Spring Term 2023.
