What does a typical day look like?


Typical Daily Timetable

Whole class exploration of a text with the focus on developing the following reading skills and strategies:

- Predicting, Asking questions, Clarifying, Summarising, Inferring, Evaluating, and Making Connections
- Our aim is to enable our children to develop good reading habits, positive learning behaviours and become confident and independent readers
- Guided reading sessions where the children read in a small group, one to one with an adult
- It is very important for your child/children to read every day at home as this will expand their vocabulary and give them the tools to be successful writers

MATHS




- Our ambition is that all pupils become confident and fluent in the fundamentals of mathematics. We use White Rose which is a practical and interactive approach with a carefully designed spiral progression and an emphasis on a concrete-pictorial-abstract approach.
- There is a strong focus on an understanding of mathematical language as well as encouraging children to explain their mathematical thinking through problem solving and reasoning.
- In Maths this term we will be looking at the place value of numbers, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division. We will also cover fractions, decimals and percentages.
- The children will be assessed daily on their maths skills in lessons.
 Interventions to close gaps will take place.



Welcome to the Jigsaw teaching and learning materials for ages 9-10.

Jigsaw is sequential, the six puzzles (units) starting with 'Being Me in My World' (BM) at the beginning of the school year and working through to the end of the year:

- BM (Being Me in My World)

- CD (Celebrating Difference)
 Respect for similarity and difference. Anti-bullying and being unique
- DG (Dreams and Goals)Aspirations, how to achieve goals and understanding the emotions that go with this
- HM (Healthy Me)
 Being and keeping safe and healthy
- RL (Relationships)
 Building positive, healthy relationships
- CM (Changing Me)Coping positively with change

Each puzzle has six lesson plans accompanied by all of the teaching and learning materials needed to deliver them.



Curriculum

Homework is given out on Wednesdays and is to be returned the following Monday. A paper copy is sent home with the homework book and a copy is also put on J2E. Work should be recorded carefully in the books in pencil or black pen. The Spelling Shed website is used for spelling games and Times Tables Rock Stars is used to practise times tables. These will be tested on the following Friday. Please do let us know if your child does not have access to these websites at home. Reading each evening is a crucial part of the homework and we cannot underestimate the benefit of enjoying books together. We have a wide selection of books at school, please do encourage your child to bring a book home each evening. If there are any questions or difficulties, please do not

Specialist Subjects/Swimming

Your child's specialist PE and French sessions will happen every Wednesday. Children are to wear their correct PE kit to school - this is a plain house coloured t-shirt, black shorts or leggings/tracksuit bottoms and black trainers. Black fleece/sweatshirt for the winter. Specialist music sessions with Mrs Peacock will be every Monday and art sessions with Ms Lincoln will continue. These will be timetabled throughout the year and will begin on Thursdays in the first half of this term. Throughout Year 5, the children will be swimming every Thursday morning at Park Road Pool. Please make sure they have their swimming trunks/costume and a swimming hat (goggles are optional) with them every week - see the letter with more details. It would be a good idea to send in a piece of fruit on this day too as swimming makes the children extra hungry!
