  - Take notice - how many? How big? What shape? Can you find...

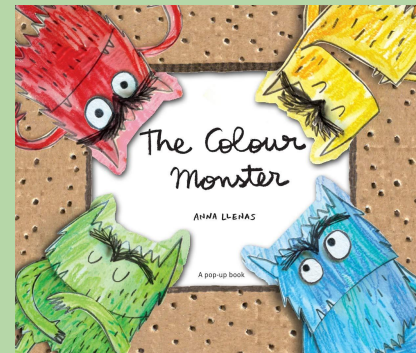
Our themes this half term are My Family and The Gingerbread Man

We are make sure there are lots of opportunities for music and rhymes as well as sharing many books.

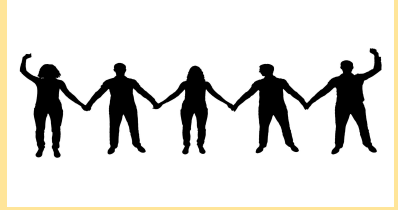
We are also working on recognising our emotions using the great book *The Colour Monster* by Anna Llenas.
